- What can you Photograph?
 Whatever makes you stop and think under Lockdown is valid. So you might see the birds in the garden who are freer than us, or an unused pair of football boots, or a spring dress that has gone unworn. Think of how it looks in the frame, and think of the light.



Hello everyone!

It is me again - Mike! I hope you are enjoying the sunshine and managing to cope with the lock down. It sounds like things are going to get more 'normal' soon and, who knows, I may even get to MEET you all.

So far we have created A Million Dreams and, with other schools, We'll Meet Again... One was about you and your school, the other about the older people in our community and those we are missing during the COVID strange times. Next we are moving onto a song of real hope – for everyone. It is hard to believe that 'Somewhere Over the Rainbow' was written over 80 years ago. It first appeared in The Wizard of Oz but since then has been sung by lots of other people including Eva Cassidy, Ariana Grande and recently Amanda Holden. Let's see what YOU come up with.

The process remains the same! **REMEMBER... THIS IS WHAT YOU NEED...**

Ideally, you will need to be able to use a

- 1. MOBILE PHONE on a table or desk. Find the VOICE RECORDER APP on it anyone will do or download a free one if your parents let you.
- 2. A TABLET OR α PC OR LAPTOP OR SECOND PHONE and
- 3. HEADPHONES PLUGGED INTO THAT TABLET / PC / LAPTOP / SECOND PHONE

HOW DOES IT WORK AGAIN?!

The MOBILE PHONE is your microphone – your recording studio and the thing you SING into. Place it on a table around 3 feet away from you.

The TABLET / PC / LAPTOP / OTHER PHONE is your 'piano player' or conductor – the person you need to follow to sing the right thing at the right time – the thing you LISTEN to.

The HEADPHONES are how you are able to listen to the music. BUT THERE IS A SPECIAL TRICK. You need to keep one headphone on your ear and the other one OFF the other ear. This will help you to hear the music... BUT ALSO hear your voice! If you have both headphones on it becomes difficult to know if you are singing the right tune! TRUST ME – it's what we do in recording studios!

- 1. REMEMBER TO WARM UP YOUR VOICE. When we meet I will show you lots of ways to do this but for now, stand up straight, relax your shoulders and yawn, (YES! Yawn) a couple of times. The muscles in your face and neck are the same for singing as they are yawning!
- 2. HAVE A LISTEN AND A SING. Pop your headphones on to listen to THIS TRACK on your TABLET / PC / LAPTOP / OTHER PHONE.

Sing the whole thing a couple of times – nice and loud! It is quite long and maybe slower than you know it but do your best.

I have popped the words down below. Don't worry about using your phone to record at this stage. Try it with both headphones on – then just one... it takes some getting used to but it is worth practising. Unfortunately, this song doesn't have the click to listen to but sing along with Rosie, (my daughter and it should keep you in time!

YOU WILL ALSO HEAR ME COUNT IN USING THE FIRST NOTE YOU NEED TO SING FOR THE FIRST WORD!

Try practising with your headphone a few times.

- 1. RECORDING. When you think you are ready sing the WHOLE song the very best you can, ask someone to start recording using the PHONE voice recorder app. Listen back to it REMEMBER you will only hear YOUR voice which might sound a little bit funny but that's what I need.
- 2. Ask your parent or guardian to send your recorded clip back to THIS school email music@st-aloysius.co.uk! The school will send me your clips and I will add them to our anthem!
- 3. FINALLY.... If you DON'T have headphones you can still take part. Play #TRACK 2 quietly and record yourself (see point 4 above) and get a little closer to your PHONE. It isn't ideal but I don't want you to miss out.
- 4. As ever, IF YOU OR A PARENT HAS QUESTIONS SEND THEM TO THE SCHOOL AT music@st-aloysius.co.uk and they will send them on to me!

It is a beautiful song and remember that RAINBOWS always come after the rain — so if you are feeling a bit fed up with this COVID thing — hang on to the fact that the sun WILL shine again soon — and the world will be better than it ever was before.
